News & World Report - in collaboration with School Evaluation Services, a K-12 education and data research and analysis business that provides parents with education data on schoolmasters.com - analyzed academic and enrollment data from more that 21,000 public high schools to find the very best across the country. These top schools were placed into gold, silver, bronze, or honorable mention categories.

Facts from the report:

Out of 21,069 schools analyzed:

- 100 schools were chosen as Gold Medal Schools
- 504 schools were chosen as Silver Medal Schools

In Texas:

- * There were 10 Gold Medal Schools, all except Highland Park High School, are Magnet Schools
- * There were 22 Silver Medal Schools, 10 of which are Magnet Schools
- * There were 119 Bronze Medal Schools

In El Paso County:

- * There were no Gold Medal Schools
- * There were 3 Silver Medal Schools, 2 of which are Magnet Schools
- * There is one Bronze Medal School, Tornillo High School

What does this all mean?

- * Fabens High School was selected as one of America's Best High Schools by U. S. News & World Report
- * Fabens High School is one of 504 high schools, out of 21,069 High Schools in America to be recognized as a Silver Medal School
- * Fabens High School is one of 22 high schools in Texas to be selected as a Silver Medal School
- * Fabens High School is one of 3 high schools in El Paso County to be selected as a Silver Medal School, with the other two being Magnet Schools


